Spectator & Racer Pathway

- No congregating before or after any events.
- Pathway created for each event that allows for physical distancing as spectators and racers to move from parking, through lines, and to their designated areas.
- Established one-way entry, exits, and paths.
- Signage to indicate social distancing in lines and throughout Derby Downs.
- Shuttles will be monitored by volunteer drivers to ensure compliance with social distancing standards.
- Installed partitions between ticketing staff/volunteers and spectators and racers.
- Developed an egress plan to allow for social distancing when spectators and racers leave, including in case of inclement weather.
- Seating will be assigned in groups of no more than four people. Members of a single household may be seated together. Spectators must sit in the assigned seats or spaces.
- Each group seated will be spaced at least 6 feet in each direction from other groups.
- Spectators trackside is allowable only to the extent physical distancing between groups of spectators will be marked and strictly maintained trackside.
- Use of assigned arrival times in place for each event.
- Temperature checks will be taken before entering Derby Downs.

Facial Covering

- Staff, volunteers, and spectators must wear a cloth face covering at all times.
- Racers must wear a face covering at all times until they have entered their assigned Soap Box Derby car. All racers must put facial coverings back on once the Soap Box Derby car has come to a complete stop.
- Facial covering requirements will be reinforced with signage and announcements throughout the event.

Cleaning and Hygiene

- Frequently clean high-touch areas (examples: railings, restrooms, cars, and helmets).
- Allow adequate time between assigned times to allow for cleaning.
- Developed a procedure for cleaning and disinfecting if a COVID-19 case is identified at Derby Downs.
- Waiting area marked outside of restrooms.
- Space between restrooms to allow for physical distancing.
- Hand sanitizer readily available throughout Derby Downs.
- Promote hand hygiene through signage.

Handling Sick/Symptomatic People

- A symptom assessment will be completed for each guest upon arrival. Symptoms include fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, and diarrhea.
- Any person with symptoms consistent with COVID-19 will be advised to return home.
- Immediate isolation of sick person and referral to medical care.

Signage and Education

- Communication will be sent out before each event. Information will include but not be limited to:
 - Importance of staying home if sick, face-covering requirement, and need to maintain physical distancing.
- Signage installed concerning hygiene, physical distancing, and face covering.
- Announcements will be made at each event communicating physical separation, face covering, hygiene, and health symptoms.
